About Us

Our programs happen daily at over 75 golf facilities, community centers and schools throughout Riverside and San Bernardino Counties. Participants ages 4 – 18 progress through the program over time, deepening their understanding of life skills and golf development. The integrated approach helps kids and teens build confidence and resilience for when they are on the course, at home and in school. Every participant has the opportunity to:

- Focus on interpersonal and selfmanagement skills on and off the golf course
- Set goals and put strategies in place to make them a reality
- Learn conflict resolution, resilience and how to plan for the future
- Make healthy choices and use good judgment
- Get out on a golf course to learn the game of golf and how it relates to life
- Progress through our program and gain eligibility for First Tee national opportunities, including college scholarships, leadership series' and competitive playing opportunities

Programming

On-Course Program

Our on-course program, held at 16 facilities across the IE, seamlessly integrates learning the game of golf with characterbuilding. We create opportunities that help kids uncover their inner strength, self-confidence, and resilience that they can carry to everything they do.

School Program

We work with elementary schools to give P.E. teachers, who may not have the equipment or space to even contemplate a golf program, all the tools they need to get started. We provide training, equipment, and lesson plans that integrate life skills and character-building values with the game of golf.

Community Program

We partner with youth centers, parks and recreation departments, and after-school programs to bring the program to life and introduce golf using games that are flexible to the ages and abilities of the kids involved. Current partners include:

Program Spotlight: Youth Advisory Council

The First Tee - Inland Empire Youth Advisory Council is a service group with the intent to promote, grow and enhance the chapter.

Meetings are held quarterly at various First Tee IE locations. Some duties of the Advisory Council include:

- Provide input on programs/events and how to improve the chapter
- Assist/support FTIE fundraiser events, tournaments and parties
 - Host one or two events per year with the help of the Program Director and chapter staff





Since 2022, First Tee – Inland Empire has served as an afterschool vendor with the SBCUSD Expanded Learning Program, providing youth enrichment services to thousands of kids at over 50 elementary schools annually.

In the Inland Empire, where physical activity rates for youth are the lowest in Southern California, cost, transportation, and access often hinder participation in youth sports. According to the 2024 LA84 Play Equity Report, only 28% of Inland Empire kids meed the CDC's guidelines for physical activity, with Black and Latino youth being the least active. First Tee – Inland Empire combats these barriers by meeting students where they are: at school.

Kaylee 12, and Emily, 10, are just two of the participating students at Norton Elementary whose lives have been greatly impacted by the hands-on learning experiences provided by First Tee – Inland Empire.

"I didn't play golf before First Tee, but I wanted to try something new. It's kind of like obstacles after obstacles, which is fun," said Emily. Her words hit home - golf, like life, teaches us to navigate new challenges with a steady swing.

Both girls have gained confidence, friendships and skills through First tee. By meeting kids where they're at, in their schools and communities, First Tee – Inland Empire ensures that all children, no matter the circumstance, have access to the opportunities they deserve.
